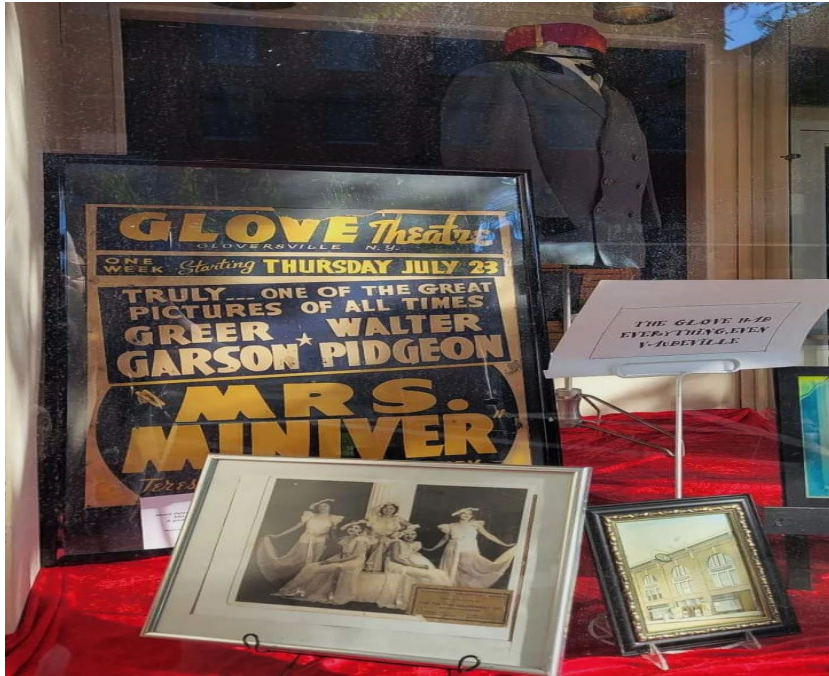

Glove Theatre Museum



The Glove Theatre Museum, 42 N. Main St., hosts a timeline of The Glove Theatre and Gloversville's past, as well as movie posters, pictures of stars and an old-style film projector from the 1920s. The theatre began in the early 1900s and was once owned by the Schine Brothers who brought in vaudeville acts from around the country. Acts included Jack Benney, Buddy Ebsen and Ann Rutherford.
