The City of Gloversville values and utilizes all of its parks and greenspaces as having a beautiful and inviting outdoors is a significant component in our quality of life.

Hosting over a dozen parks and greenspaces, each one in Gloversville has its own unique qualities. Darling Field is home to the Fulton United Soccer League and also hosts tennis courts. Basketball courts can be found at Elk Street Park. Wohlfarth's Pond is known for its fishing and a playground can be found at Spring Street Park.

In almost every park is a Little Free Lending Library for those who want to quietly enjoy the outdoors. The FJG Rail Trail not only explores the City in a fun way, but allows users to see nature at its best as deer wander through the trail and ducks swim in nearby Cayadutta Creek.
